- A.** Starting Number - Can be any number you want.
- B.** Ending Number
- C.** Number of Spots - This refers to the number of digits in the numbering. For example, if you had numbering of 1 - 100, number of spots set to 3 would produce a numbering sequence of 001, 002, 003..., set to 2 would be 01, 02, 03, etc.
- D.** Repeating Amount - Usually set to 1 unless you are making a multi-page document or form like an NCR form.
- E.** Document repeats - the number of times a document is layed out on a single sheet. (If you were printing raffle tickets you would enter the amount of times you have them layed out on a sheet)
- F.** Prefix - What you would like to proceed the numbering, can be anything you want, for example, No., #,
- G.** Non Stackable or Stackable - Stackable is what most will use as it produces numbering set up that when more than one document is layed out on a sheet to be printed, the numbering will be in stacked order for example number 1 on top, number 2, on the next sheet, 3 on the sheet under that so when cut down to size the numbering remains in order.

If you want the numbers to go across the page (if printing multiple documents on a page) use non-stackable, which will produce, for example, 1, 2, 3, etc. all on the top page before continuing to the next page.
